The City of Fort Wayne was allocated \$50.8
million in State and Local Fiscal Recovery
Funds to invest in projects and programs across
the City.

 City Council passed the City's SLFRF Recovery Plan in April 2022. As part of its recovery plan, the City allocated an aggregate amount of \$5.35 million for small businesses, non-profit organizations, public health organizations, and tourism-related organizations to provide relief to those that have experienced economic loss due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Small Business Support Grant

Max Allowable Award: \$50,000 Total Allocation: \$1,500,000

Public Health Organization Support Grant

Max Allowable Award: \$100,000 Total Allocation: \$1,350,000

Non-Profit (Non-Healthcare) Support Grant

Max Allowable Award: \$100,000 Total Allocation: \$1,500,000

Tourism-Related Industry Support Grant

Max Allowable Award: \$100,000 Total Allocation: \$1,000,000



Grant funds can be used for the following organization costs:

- Operating costs such as supplies, mortgage, rent, utilities, insurance, maintenance and repairs, and other operating costs
- Continuation and/or expansion of services/programs
- General communication, marketing, and advertising expenses
- For public health organizations ONLY: Capital Expenses
- For disproportionately impacted small businesses ONLY: physical improvements to storefronts/building facades or enhancements to outdoor spaces (e.g., restaurant patios)



Ineligible expenses not covered by grant funds include:

- Payroll expenses
- Property taxes
- New construction
- Deposits to pension funds or other retirement benefit accounts
- Payment of principal or interest on outstanding debt
- Costs of issuing new debt



Small Business Support

- Located within the City of Fort Wayne
- Exists as of March 1, 2020
- Employs <u>at least 2</u> FT employees and <u>no</u> more than 50 FT employees
- Ability to demonstrate negative economic impact/disproportionate economic impact
- Current on financial obligations to the City of Fort Wayne and the State of Indiana (property taxes, utility bills, etc.)

Disproportionately impacted: operates within a Qualified Census Tract

Nonprofit (Non-healthcare) Support

- Located within the City of Fort Wayne
- Exists as of March 1, 2020
- Ability to demonstrate negative economic impact/disproportionate economic impact (operates within a QCT)



 Proof of good standing with the Indiana Department of Revenue (i.e., screenshot from INTIME showing \$0 balance)




