Dear Flaugh Road area property owner or resident:

I am pleased to inform you that Fort Wayne City Utilities has awarded contracts for construction of a new sewer pump station and force mains that will increase the capacity of an existing large interceptor sewer in your area and will reduce overflows at the existing Golfview lift station.

This project will redirect flows from the existing Golfview Lift Station to the west to the new Flaugh Road Lift Station. From the Flaugh Road Lift Station flows will be sent south along Flaugh Road to the Neuhaus Interceptor sewer. Included in the project is the installation of approximately 10,680 linear feet of 8 and 12-inch diameter force main, construction of a new lift station and installation of approximately 2,600 linear feet of 12 and 15-inch diameter sanitary sewer.

Two different contractors have been hired to complete the work. API Construction will build the pump station and sanitary sewer and Underground Contractors, Inc. will be installing the force main. Work is expected to start in the next few weeks

I know that utility construction projects can be disruptive while they are going on. It is the goal of our staff to keep you well-informed about what is expected to happen during the project. I want you to know who to contact to answer your questions and resolve any construction issues.
