Dear Property Owner or Resident:

I am pleased to inform you that Fort Wayne City Utilities has awarded a contract for construction of a sanitary sewer project in your area that will reduce the amount of sewage mixed with stormwater that is discharged into the Maumee River each year

This project is related to the improvements planned for the Morton Street Pump Station located on Edgewater Avenue and is part of Fort Wayne's 2008 agreement with the federal government to reduce sewer overflows to our rivers. This project involves the installation of a new 54" diameter sanitary sewer force main which will begin at the Morton Street Pump Station on Edgewater Avenue. The force main then continues on Cody Avenue (between Garfield Street and Pemberton Drive). It will then cross the Pemberton Levee and go east, terminating at the storage ponds on the northside of the Maumee River adjacent to the Water Pollution Control Plant.

Cleary Construction, Inc. has been awarded the contract for construction of the project. Work is expected to begin this spring and be completed in late summer of 2019.

I know that utility construction projects can be disruptive for neighborhoods while they are going on. It is the goal of our staff to keep you well-informed about what is expected to happen during the project. I want you to know who to contact to answer your questions and resolve any construction issues.
