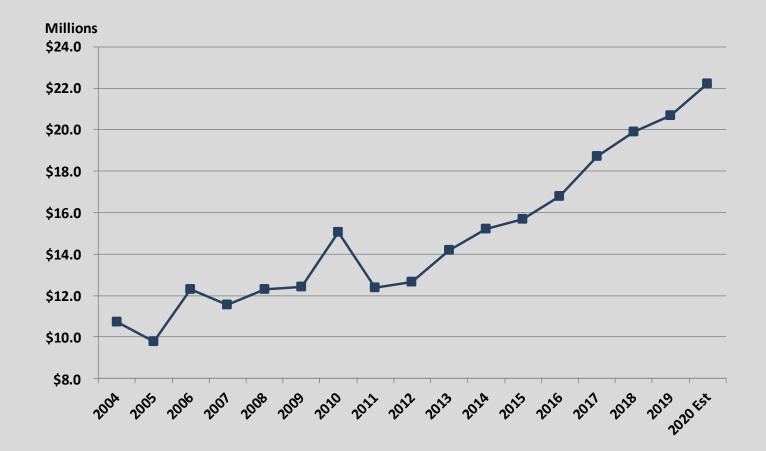
Local Income Tax (LIT) – Economic Development Distribution to City (formerly CEDIT)

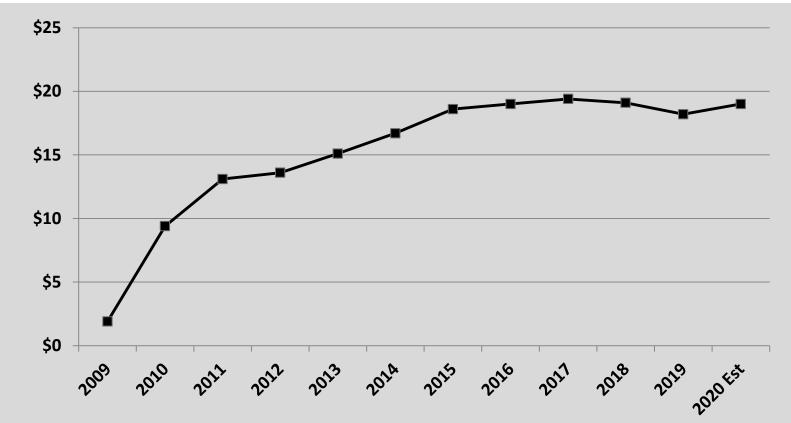

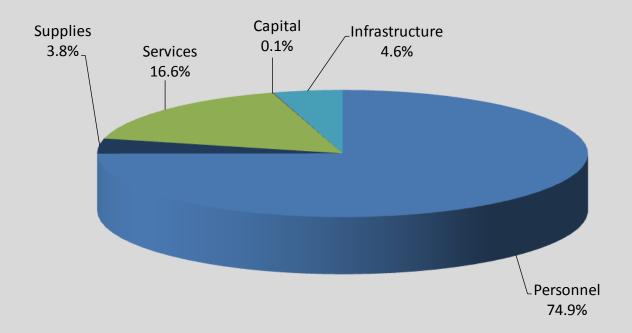

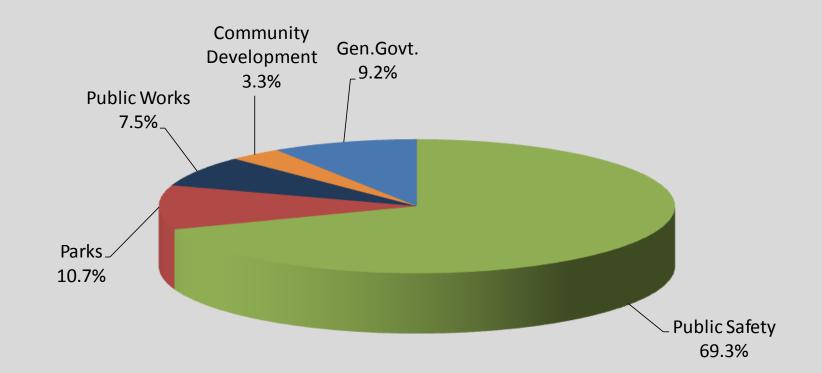
2020 Property Tax/PS LOIT Expenses by Series

Fiscal Notes



- Assessed Value growth 7 years in a row
- Fire and Police at full TARGET staffing
- Levy growth of 3.5%
- Streets & Roads spending of \$23.9 million
- Sidewalks & Alleys spending of \$8 million
- Bridge spending of \$1.4 million
- Parks capital work funded @ \$3.0 million
