#### **LEARNING TRACT DEFINITIONS**

#### Focus Area 1: Planning

Planning speaking topics focus on how local stakeholders (neighborhood residents and community leaders) come together to envision and shape the future of neighborhoods and communities. Example topics include: what makes a healthy neighborhood, strategic thinking, project implementation, etc.

Past topics have included: Healthy & Livable Communities, Placemaking, Transportation, Community Gardens, and Crime Prevention & Safety

#### Focus Area 2: Activation

Activation speaking topics provide neighborhood residents and leaders with tools and project examples that build their capacity to lead and implement projects and events. Speakers can focus on beautification projects, community advocacy, member recruitment, event hosting, etc.

Past topics have included: Youth Engagement, Public Art, Meeting Facilitation, Governance & Finance, and Fundraising & Grant Opportunities

#### Focus Area 3: Collaboration

Collaboration speaking topics focus on developing, building, leveraging, and strengthening partnerships and resources between neighborhood associations and other entities including stakeholders, corporations, foundations, non-profits, other neighborhoods, etc.

Past topics have included: Engaging immigrants and refugees, Intersectional experience, Government Basics, and Understanding Trauma

### Focus Area 4: Play/ Rest

Making room for self-care, rest, and fun is essential to creating well-run neighborhood associations, and cultivating sustainable growth for people and communities. Speakers who choose topics in this focus area can talk about social activities, team building efforts, mental-health practices, and more.

Past topics have included: Resting Well, Avoiding Burnout
